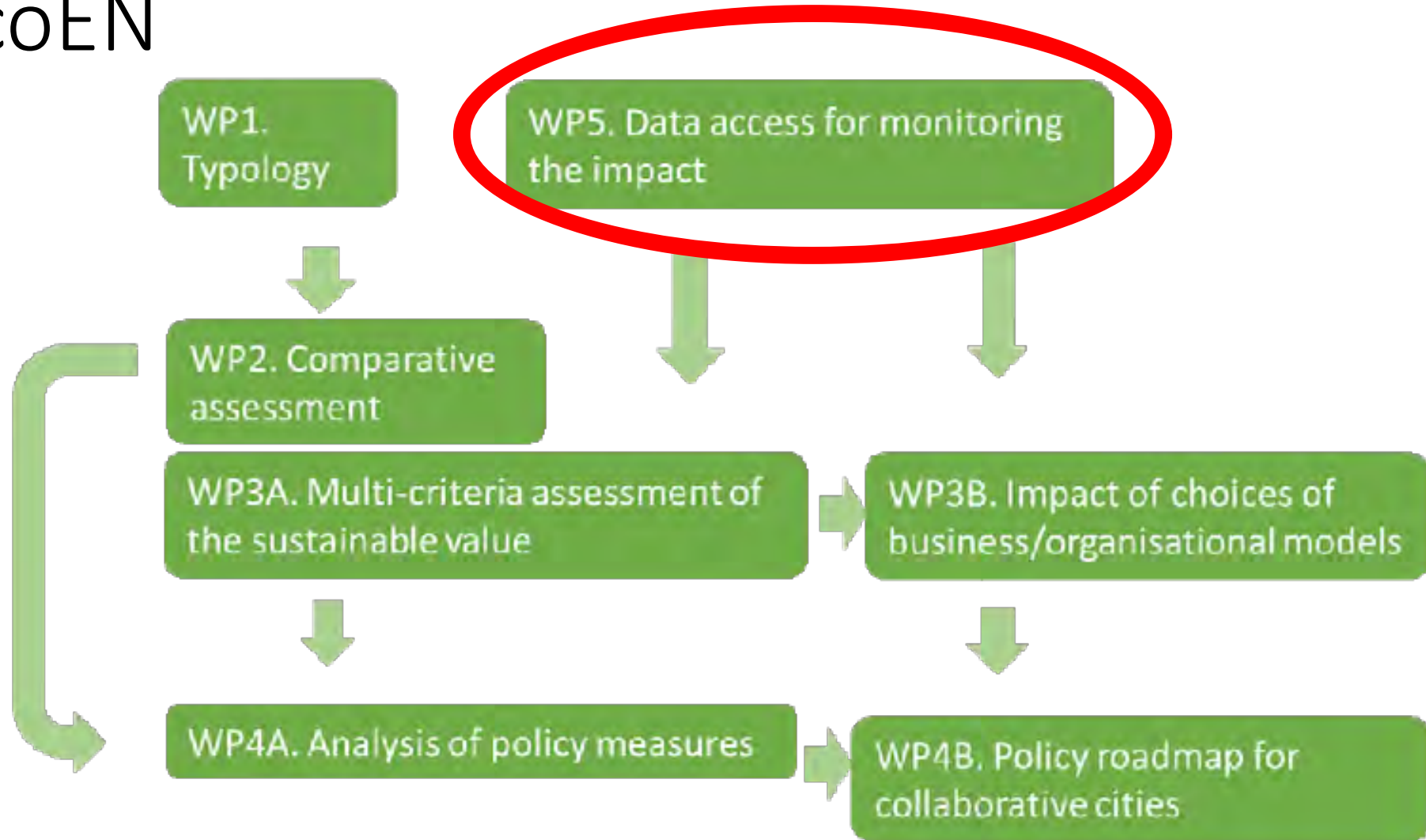

# Issue : data and mobility



- New data-based initiatives: TfL Transparency Strategy
  - The Strategy explains our commitment to transparency, which starts with a presumption that all our information should be made publicly available (and, in the case of data, provided in machine readable form), unless there are legitimate reasons why not - for example, disproportionate cost, personal data or information which would harm our ability to maximise value for money for customers and tax payers.
  - “The strategy includes TfL’s open-data feeds, which are freely available to a community of more than 12,000 developers. More than 40 per cent of Londoners use an app or website powered by data to plan their journeys ranging from live bus times and location to information on air quality and walking times between TfL stations.”
  - New consultation of Sept. 2017

# Data collection

- Private hire license in London
  - Collection of itineraries
- Greyball
  - Deceptive use of data
  - Targeted against public authorities
- Refusal of License renewal
  - Bargain: fines and... sharing more data!



# Data pooling: Waze



- Waze offers real-time information to TfL
- TfL offers planned interruption information (*e.g.* road works, public events, etc)
- No money exchange: data against data
- Improved mobility flows
  - Also in Florida, in Brazil

# Obstacles to improved sharing of data

- Reluctance of private operators (platforms) to share?
- Legal issues such as personal data protection as an excuse?
- Lack of adequate licensing arrangements?
- Lack of standards (API) for easy access and sharing of data?
- No real interest by new players in accessing the data (awareness)?
- Lack of resources to manage the data abundance?
- Others?

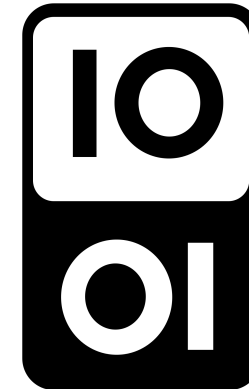
